Zadanie 3.

Man: With us today we have Josie, who is a flight attendant and she will be sharing her job-related experiences. Josie, first of all, can you tell us how passengers annoy flight attendants?

Woman: Hello, everybody. Well, there are two things which, in my opinion, cabin crew dislike most. The first relates to moving baggage around in the overhead compartments. It's OK to rearrange your own baggage in the compartment above your seat, of course, but I really can't stand it if you handle other people's belongings in compartments above their seats. Not only does this annoy other passengers, but it can also make it difficult for people to find their things when leaving the plane.

Man: And what's the second thing?
